APPENDIX B TO THE RULES OF THE SOCIETY RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY IN HORSE EVENTS

In the event of Show cancellation fees will be refunded less 10% to cover administration costs.

The Heathfield Show Society reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any animal for any reason they may deem unfit.

1. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to insure all property and livestock which is brought on to the Showground and which is his/ her own, or for which he/she is responsible. The Society requires exhibitors to effect Employers Liability insurance where this is required by statute. The Society also requires exhibitors to effect Public Liability insurance and Products Liability insurance. The Society therefore requires that all exhibitors ensure that they have the appropriate insurance cover for showing purposes.
2. All entries must be accompanied by the correct remittance.
3. Entries are received on condition that the Society accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or accident etc., which may be sustained to vehicles, horses, persons or any property whatsoever.
4. The closing date for entries is 15th April 2020, late entries will be accepted on-line only up to 4th May but will be subject to a Late Entry Fee of £10 with no guarantee of being included in the printed programme.
5. Should insufficient entries be received for any one class, the Society reserves the right to combine two or more classes forward on Show day.
6. The Society reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any exhibitor for any reason they may deem unfit.
8. Forfeiture of Fees. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and no refund will be made in any circumstances.
9. Objections or any matter involving the judging of a class shall be submitted in writing to the Show Secretary within 60 minutes of the judging of the event being completed, accompanied by a deposit of £25.00, non-returnable, if the objection is overruled. Any objection will be considered by the Show Secretary with two members of the relevant Show Committee.
10. Rapping in the collecting ring or anywhere on or in the vicinity of the Showground is strictly prohibited.
11. Riders must keep to the Official Exercising Grounds and must use the Horse Walks for access to all rings on the Showground.
12. Exhibitors must abide by the rules of the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting.
13. Anybody RIDING a horse/pony on the Showground or LEADING a horse/pony on the Horse Walk, in the Collecting Ring or in the Show Rings must be wearing a hat approved by the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting if so required by that governing body or association. All competitors in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter classes must wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS015, VG1, 1384, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 ALONG WITH another accepted standard, will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384 & PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own. Grooms must wear a hat if entering the ring unless the governing body under which the class is being shown stipulates otherwise and the exhibitor has signed a Heathfield & District Agricultural Show waiver form sent to the exhibitors of classes 174, 175 & 179. All under 18's, Adults competing in intermediate and HOYS M&M classes and all affiliated Ponies UK and BSPA classes must wear: PAS 015 VG1 or ASTM F1163 04a onwards
14. Exhibitors Admission Tickets and Vehicle Passes: All exhibitors will be supplied with wristbands on a strict scale according to the number of animals entered, plus a vehicle pass. It should be noted that all passes are issued for the use of the exhibitor only and are strictly non-transferable. Any person (whether owner, servant, driver or rider) not wearing a wrist band must pay the appropriate charge at the gate. Provision is made on the Remittance Form for additional tickets to be purchased (at the advanced price).

15. Vehicle Parking: To be allowed access to the designated parking area apart from the public car parks, all vehicles must carry an exhibitor's vehicle pass showing the exhibitor's name and telephone number. No vehicle access will be allowed to any other areas of the Showground unless prior arrangements have been made.
16. All correspondence regarding changes to ring timings, etc., will be on headed notepaper and signed by the Show Secretary. If in doubt, please check with the Show Secretary.
17. Safety. The organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all the Officials and Stewards. Animals must not be left unattended or left unsupervised when tied up to vehicles on any part of the showground at any time. No wheeled items, prams, pushchairs or mobility aids are allowed in the horse walk, collecting and judging rings, except the approved vehicles in the driving classes or any vehicles approved by the Society.
18. The use of mobile phones is not permitted within judging rings.
19. VETERINARY: The Heathfield Show Veterinary Officer's decision is final.
 - a) Contagion: Every exhibitor of any animal which to their knowledge is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which has been in contact with any animal suffering as such, shall pay the Society £50 as compensation and for liquidated damages for each and every animal so sent. In addition, in the event of the Show's Vet certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the Participant, from the Showground, or be otherwise managed as per the Vet's direction with a view to averting the spread of contagion.
 - b) It is a condition of entry that in the event of a serious accident to an animal and on the recommendation of the Show Vet that the animal be slaughtered all efforts will be made to contact the animal's owner for consent to slaughter. If the owner cannot be found within a reasonable period of time, a police officer on site will be asked to provide written authority as empowered under the Protection of Animals Act 2006. If emergency veterinary treatment is required at the Show, exhibitors will be responsible for the cost of any medication or drugs used in the treatment of their animals and payment must be made direct to the veterinary officer at the time of treatment.
 - c) Any animal that is receiving veterinary treatment at the time of the Show should not be entered unless the owner has had the animal examined by their own Vet and it is safe for them to enter the Show. However, animals still showing evidence of disease will not be permitted to be shown.
20. Vaccination: It is required that all horses and ponies entering the Showground are vaccinated and the exhibitor must be able to produce a vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that animal, completed, signed and stamped by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received 3 primary vaccinations against Equine Influenza, the first two given not less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart with a follow up injection 150-215 days later. In addition a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding twelve months. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days, including the day of the Show. Spot checks will be carried out on entry to the lorry park. Drivers not able to produce a valid certificate will not be permitted and asked to leave the show ground.
21. All horses must comply with current legislation. There will be random checks during Show day of Horse Passports and/or microchips.
22. Once a class has started exhibitors will only be permitted to enter the judging ring with the express permission of the judge.
23. Qualifying cards that are required to be signed by the judge must be signed in the ring.
24. Exhibitors should carefully read the Rules of the Society and by making an entry to the Show the exhibitor is expressly agreeing to comply with the aforementioned Rules.
25. HORSE ENTRIES CLOSE: 15TH April
LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UP TO 4TH MAY ON LINE ONLY. (Late entries will not appear in the Show programme and there will be an additional £10 admin fee per late entries)

Conformation – Miss Rebecca Adlam (Buckinghamshire)**

*Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all owners, exhibitors and riders must be Association members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration number must be quoted on entry form.***

*Classes 150, 151 & 152 are qualifiers for **THE ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW 2020**. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.*

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

*The three highest placed prize winners in all Open affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the **BSHA Classic Supreme Classes** at the National Championship Show 2020.*

*The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each **Open** class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).*

*Ponies Association (UK). 1st, 2nd and 3rd exhibitors placed in each class will qualify for the **Ponies Association (UK) Ridden Cob Gold Medal Series** to include Maxi Cobs at the Ponies Association (UK) Summer Classic on the 16th August 2020 at Addington Equestrian Centre.*

- 150 Open Maxi Cob** Mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155 cms -to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short-legged animals of COB type). Winners of these classes (Maxi) are not eligible for Open Cob Championships.
- 151 Open Lightweight Cob** Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, capable of carrying more than 14 stone, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms
- 152 Open Heavyweight Cob** Mare or gelding, 4years old and over, capable of carrying more than 14 stone exceeding 148cms. Not exceeding 155cms

COB CHAMPIONSHIP 1st & 2nd from classes 151 & 152: Champion £10, Reserve £5.

The two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight and Heavyweight Hunter Classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. All regulations applicable to HOYS qualifiers will apply also to RIHS qualifiers. Amateur ridden hunter class the two highest placed smalls, the two highest placed lightweights, the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify.*

All entries in Classes 153 -156 & 177 must be on Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain 2020 Show Hunter Register. (Registration Numbers to be shown on Entry Forms and owners and riders must be full members of Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain).

Day ticket = £36 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year – at £36 per show it covers rider and owner membership together with horse registration for that show.

Classes 153-156, 169-173 & 177 are Judged under the 2020 Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules.

*1st, 2nd & 3rd placed competitors in Classes 153-156 will qualify for **The PONIES Association (UK) Open Hunter Gold Medal Series** at the Ponies Association (UK) Summer Classic on the 16th August 2020 at Addington Equestrian Centre provided the riders have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.*

*The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified in classes 153-156 will qualify for the **Equifest Ridden Hunter Final** to be held at the East of England Showground on the 19th – 23rd August 2020.*

*This show is a qualifier for the **Blue Chip & Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Challenge**. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from each of the following Classes 153 to 156 that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Register, **i.e. with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding**, will qualify for the Final of the Blue Chip & IDHS (GB) £2,000 Challenge. Horses need not be registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) to qualify but must be on the IDHS (GB) Registers by the time of the Championship which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show on 22nd - 23rd August 2020 at Arena UK, Allington, Grantham, Lincolnshire. NG32 2EF. **N.B: A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.** Each qualifier will receive a card and a £10 voucher from Blue Chip. Will immediately follow the **Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at www.idhs.gb.com to inform the IDHS (GB) that they are qualified for the Final.** Following submission of the online form, a qualifier's pack will be sent out direct to the qualifier.*

A brief description of the vehicle to be included with the entry form. £20 travelling expenses will be awarded to each exhibitor.

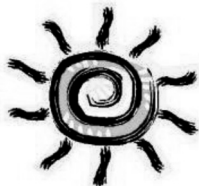

CLASS

163 Unaffiliated Retrained Racehorse Challenge

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years old or over on the 1st January 2020. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED.

Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps (2' 6" to 3' with a maximum spread of 85 cm)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down.

15 points to be deducted for a refusal.
20 points for second refusal.

Elimination for third refusal or fall

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. *(In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)*

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements:

Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Prizes : Rosettes 1st-6th and Vouchers 1st to 4th place.

MOUNTED FANCY DRESS COMPETITION

May be prejudged in the Collecting Ring if time is limiting

164 Mounted Fancy Dress

Hard Hats must be worn at all times. Competitors must be aged between 4 years old and 16 years old. Class to be split by age if sufficient entries. Trophy for overall winner. Rosette to all entries.

RIDDEN COLOURED HORSES AND PONIES

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 20039

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge.

Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 12th – 15th August 2020.

Classes 165 & 166 are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception
